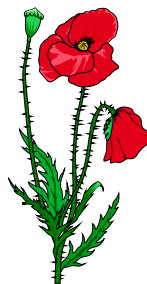

<i>B</i>	Named on the Burwash High Street Memorial and on the memorial in St Bartholomew’s Church, Burwash
<i>P</i>	Named on the Memorial in St Phillp’s Churchyard, Burwash Weald, or buried there.
<i>J</i>	Named on the Memorial in St Joseph’s Roman Catholic Churchyard, Spring Lane, Burwash, or buried there.
<i>C</i>	Born in or connected with Burwash, but not named on any of the village memorials.

Nearly all local Great War memorial committees throughout the country seem to have been rather hap-hazard in their researching and selection of names.

VISITED = This grave or memorial has been visited since 1998, very often on the biennial village pilgrimages to France and Flanders.

Notes

This Burwash roll contains the names of 138 dead from the First World War and 29 dead from the Second World War plus 2 officially listed Civilian War Dead. (Page 30.) This 29 does not include an RAF pilot who crashed within the Parish and is buried elsewhere nor similarly a Luftwaffe pilot. (Page 31.)

The population of Burwash in 1914 is estimated to have been about 2100. (Based on the 1911 census) It is believed that 500 men and women (one woman died whilst serving) served in the Forces during the Great War. There is a list of 491 of them starting on page 31.

Most of the information comes from the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, the East and West Sussex County Record Offices, the Imperial War Museum, the Public Record Office at Kew, 'Soldiers who died in the Great War', studying graves in the churchyards and countless Press cuttings. Old editions of the Burwash and Burwash Weald Monthly Magazine have given us the list of those Serving and assistance from families has been most appreciated.

The addresses are normally those given to the Imperial War Graves Commission by the next of kin immediately after the war. Some addresses are deduced from press cuttings.

Any further information or corrections that the Reader may be able to provide on any entry in this Roll would be most appreciated.

SOUTH AFRICA 1898-1901

EDWARD PENNELLS

Private, 738, 'F' Company, 1st Bn. Rifle Brigade. Killed in action 26th December 1900 at the Oceana Mine, Battle of Grootvlei. Buried firstly at Greylingstadt Cemetery and then re-buried at Standerton British Garden of Remembrance, Mpumalanga (formally The Transvaal) South Africa. Memorial plaque in St. Bartholomew's Church.

Private, 105175, 1st Canadian Mounted Rifles, Saskatchewan Regiment. Died on day of his unit's attack just north of Pozières 15th September 1916. Age 20. Son of George Baird, Southover Cottages, Burwash. I N 10 Albert Communal Cemetery, Somme.

VISITED

FREDERICK CHARLES BALCOMBE *B*

Private, FC. 47550, 13th Bn. Royal Scots, formerly RASC . Died of wounds (gas): 3rd September 1917 whilst prisoner of war. Age 23. Born in Burwash. Enlisted in Hastings. Son of William Thomas and Annie Balcombe, of 1 Prospect Place, Burwash, Sussex. XII.D.4. Harlebeke New British Cemetery, Flanders. **VISITED** (German made) Battlefield cross in St. Bartholomew's Church porch.

BENJAMIN BALDOCK *P*

Private, 48615, 8th Bn. Welsh Regiment, formerly Royal Sussex. Died 10th September 1917 in Mesopotamia. Born in Best Beech, Wadhurst. Enlisted in Eastbourne. Resident in Mayfield. XIV.B.5 Amara War Cemetery, Iraq. Also on Old Heathfield Memorial

ARNOLD HARDING BALL *C*

Lieutenant, 5th Bn Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action at Guinchy 9th April 1918. Age 29. Of Houndstall House, Mark Cross. Son of Mr. W.E. Ball, LLD and Mrs. M.A. Ball of Brasted, Kent; husband of Sylvia N. Roe (formerly Ball), of Dudwell House, Burwash, Sussex. N.41, Cambrin Military Cemetery, Pas de Calais. On Tidebrook and Mark Cross Memorials. **VISITED**

ALEXANDER BISHOP *C*

Private, G/3380 9th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 25th September 1915 at Battle of Loos. Age 25. Born in Burwash, Sussex. Enlisted in Battle. Son of Thomas and Hannah Bishop of Coombers Farm, Dallington, Sussex. No known grave. Panel 71 Loos Memorial, Pas de Calais. On Dallington Memorial. **VISITED**

JAMES BISHOP C

Private, L/8353, 2nd Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 17th August 1916 at High Wood. Age 28. Born in Burwash, Sussex. Enlisted in St.Leonard's. Son on Thomas and Hannah Bishop of Palmers Cottages, Dallington. No known grave. 7 C Thiepval Memorial, Somme. On Dallington Memorial. **VISITED**

GEORGE BLACKFORD C

Private, 6956 Machine Gun Corps (Inf) formerly East Kent Regiment (The Buffs). Killed in action 10th July 1917. Born in Burwash, Sussex. Enlisted ACOL. No known grave. Nieuport Memorial, West-Vlaanderen, Flanders. **VISITED**

CHARLES FREDERICK WILLIAM BOOTH B

Private, SX/10339, 2nd Bn Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 9th May 1915 at Battle of Aubers Ridge. Age 18. Born in Dallington. Enlisted in Battle. Son of Frederick W and Mrs Booth of Manor Cottage, Brightling, Sussex. XXVII.E.38. Cabaret-Rouge British Cemetery, Pas de Calais, also on Brightling Memorial. **VISITED**

GEORGE THOMAS BRABAN C

Private, G/12135, 7th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 20th November 1917 just east of present Junction 9 on A26, (Sonnet Farm,) Battle of Cambrai. Born in Burwash, Sussex. Enlisted in Hastings. No known grave. Panel 7 Cambrai Memorial, Louveral, Nord. **VISITED**

FREDERICK GEORGE BRIGNELL P

Private, G/18379, 7th Bn. Queen's Own (Royal West Kent Regiment), formerly Royal Sussex. Killed in action 14th February 1917 in attack on Grandcourt Trench. Age 30. Born in Burwash. Enlisted at Hastings. Son of Isabel Copper (formerly Brignell), of School Hill, Burwash, Sussex and the late Frederick George Brignell; husband of Louisa Emily Jenner, formerly Brignell of Witherenden Lane, Burwash Common, of Smart's Hill, Penshurst, Tonbridge, Kent. "Buried by his friends" but grave lost in battle." 11 C Thiepval Memorial, Somme. **VISITED**

ARTHUR BROOK MM P

Lance Corporal, G/1920 17th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Died of wounds 22nd February 1919. Age 28. Born in Waldron. Son of Philip and Sophia Brook of Burwash Common. 1V.F.17 Dunkirk Town Cemetery, Nord. **VISITED**

Awarded the Military Medal for acts of gallantry and devotion to duty under fire.

CECIL BROOK B

Lance Corporal, G/4719, 8th Bn. Queens Own (Royal West Kent Regiment), formerly Royal Sussex. Killed in action 9th December 1916 near Posen Crater. Age 19. Born in Burwash. Enlisted in Hastings. Son of James Henry and Ellenor Clara Brook of 2 Bankside, Burwash, Sussex. . II.D.6. Philosphe British Cemetery , Marzingarbe, Pas de Calais. **VISITED**

CHARLES ALFRED BROOK B

Corporal, G/4146, 2nd Bn Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 20th August 1916 at High Wood. Age 35. Born in Burwash. Enlisted in London. Son of Charles Albert Brook of Burghurst, Burwash. No known grave. Pier Face 7c Thiepval Memorial, Somme . **VISITED**

ERNEST JAMES BROWN MM B

Lance Corporal, SD/1157, 11th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action in attack on Schwaben Redoubt on 12th October 1916. Age 27. Born 'St. Peter's'. Formally on the Staff at Hastings Pier. Enlisted in Bexhill. Son of William and Emily Brown, of 20, Emmanuel Road., Hastings; husband of Annie B. Brown of 4 Portland Terrace, Burwash, Sussex. II.B.11. Hamel Military Cemetery, Somme. Battlefield Cross in St. Bartholomew's Church porch. **VISITED**

HARRY BUTCHER B

Sergeant, 23817, 1st Garrison Bn. Bedfordshire Regiment, formerly Royal Sussex Regiment. Died of wounds 23rd July 1919. Age 32. Born in Burwash, Sussex. Enlisted in Chichester. Son of William and Harriette Butcher, of Lower Stoneham, Lewes. Western II.YS.3. Lewes Cemetery, Sussex.

ALBERT HENRY CHANDLER B

Private, 511554, 1st/5th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 9th May 1915 at Aubers Ridge. Age 19. Born in Burwash, Sussex. Enlisted in Robertsbridge. Son of George and Alice Chandler of Fontridge Lane, Etchingham, Sussex. IV.D.20 Woburn Abbey Cemetery, Cuinchy, Pas de Calais. Also on Etchingham Memorial. **VISITED**

ARTHUR CHARLES CHITTENDEN B

Lance Corporal, 10488, 5th Bn. King's Shropshire Light Infantry. Killed in action 25th January 1916. Age 18. Born in Bromyard, Worcestershire. Enlisted in Shrewsbury. Resident in Burwash. Son of Thomas and Bertha Alice Chittenden, of 16, Greenfield Road, Burwash, Sussex. I.H.7. Essex Farm Cemetery, Flanders. Battlefield cross in St. Bartholomew's Church porch. **VISITED**

RONALD HOPE CLARK C

Second Lieutenant, 16th Bn. Rifle Brigade, (Prince Consort's Own.) Died of wounds 24th March 1918. Age 33. Son of Samuel Frank and Agnes Clark; husband of Gwendoline Violet Clark of Brian Cottage, Burwash, Sussex. VII.F.1. St. Pierre (Amiens) Cemetery, Somme. **VISITED**

JOHN THOMAS CORKE B

Private, 53165, 17th Bn. The King's (Liverpool Regiment), formerly Queen's Own. Died of wounds 2nd May 1918. Age 23. Born Brockam Hill, Kent. Enlisted in Tunbridge Wells. Resident of Burwash. Franchise Lodge? II.B.25. Esquelbecq Military Cemetery, Nord. **VISITED**

PERCY CORNWELL P

Lance Corporal, G/2259, 8th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Died of wounds 6th September 1917. Age 24. Born in Heathfield. Enlisted in Eastbourne. Son of William H. and Ruth Cornwell of Down Oaks Cottage, Westfield, Battle, Sussex. I B 54 Duhallo ADS Cemetery, Ypres, Flanders **VISITED**

ALBERT CORNWELL *P* (*Cornwall on CWGC lists*)

Able Seaman, 189092, (RFR/PO/B/2109), Royal Navy, H.M.S. ALCANTARA (Armed Merchant Cruiser). Killed in action with raider GREIF in North Sea 29th February 1916. Age 37. Son of Alfred and Sally Cornwell of Burwash Common, Sussex; husband of Mary Cornwell of 27 Wellington Gardens, Battle, Sussex. Panel 12, Portsmouth Naval Memorial. Also on Old Heathfield Memorial. **VISITED**

GEORGE ROBERT COTTINGHAM *B*

Private, 18582, 2nd Bn. Coldstream Guards. Died of wounds 23rd March 1918. Age 26. Born in Wadhurst. Enlisted in Hastings. Resident of Burwash. Husband of Annie E.M. Cottingham of Totts Cottages, Burwash I.B 15 Bac-du-Sud British Cemetery, Bailleulval, Pas de Calais. **VISITED**

FRANK WILLIAM COUCHMAN *C*

Sergeant G/13673, 6th Bn. The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Killed in action 3rd October 1917 in front line southeast of Wancourt. Age 32. Born in Horsemonden. Enlisted in Ashford. Son of George and Ellen Couchman of Horsemonden, Kent; husband of Eva G. Couchman of Glebe House, Burwash, Sussex. I.E.20 Windmill British Cemetery, Monchy-le-Preux, Pas de Calais. **VISITED**

FREDERICK JOHN EDWARD DANN *B*

Private, (Drummer) G/3904, 9th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 3rd June 1916 west of Messines. Age 20. Born in Burwash. Enlisted in Hastings. Son of Mrs E. Dann of Morden Cottages, Burwash. II.B.7. Ration Farm Cemetery, (La Plus Douve) Annexe, Ploegsteert, Flanders. **VISITED**

GEORGE DANN *B*

Petty Officer, 146362, Royal Navy. H.M.S. AMETHYST. Died 19th May 1915 of wounds received in action off Gallipoli. Age 42. Son of Edward and Emily Dann, of Burwash, Sussex; husband of Rachel A. Dann of 27, Mayfield Road, Belvedere, Kent. Buried at sea. Portsmouth Memorial. **VISITED**

EDWARD DIVALL *B*

Lance Corporal, G/21713, 9th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 4th November 1918 at Wagnies Le Petit, southeast of Valenciennes. Age 30. Enlisted in Hastings. Husband of Lilian May Divall of Elphick's Cottage, Burwash, Sussex. I.F.13. Cross Roads Cemetery, Fontaine-au-Bois, Nord. **VISITED** Battlefield cross in St. Bartholomew's Church porch, Burwash.
1998 - Father of Mrs. Lilian Funnell, High Street, Burwash

WILLIAM HENRY DOUCH *B*

Private, G34572, 12th Bn. probably attached to 2nd Bn. Middlesex Regiment, formerly Royal Fusiliers. Killed in action 31st July 1917 in area covered by present Junction 4 of A19 motorway, battle of Pilkem Ridge. Age 29. Born in Burwash. Enlisted in Hastings. Son of Lydia Elizabeth Douch, of School Hill, Burwash, Sussex. No known grave. Panel 51, Ypres, Menin Gate Memorial, Flanders. **VISITED**

ROBERT DUNBAR *P*

Colour Sergeant Major, PO2210, Royal Marine Light Infantry, Anson Bn., Royal Naval Division. Killed in action 6th May 1915 at Gallipoli. Age 52. Born Carlton, Glasgow. Husband of Ellen Dunbar of Knowle Cottage, Broad Oak, Sussex. No known grave. Panel 2/7 Helles Memorial, Gallipoli, Turkey. Also on Heathfield Memorial.

RICHARD FREDERICK EDWARDS *C*

Private, TF/2380, 1st/5th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Missing, listed killed in action at Battle of Aubers Ridge 9th May 1915. Enlisted in Wadhurst. Son of Mr. Reuban Edwards of the Cottage, Court Lodge Farm, Burwash. No known grave. Panel 20, Le Touret Memorial, Pas de Calais. Most curiously not on the Burwash High Street Memorial. **VISITED**

SIDNEY WILLIAM ELLIS *C*

Private, 81297, 149 Company, Machine Gun Corps (Inf). Died of wounds when prisoner of war, on 23rd May 1918. Age 31. Born in Burwash. Enlisted in Woolwich. Son of William John and Harriet Ellis of Englefield, Etchingham; husband of May Ellis of Brookside, Etchingham, Sussex. XI D1 Berlin South-Western Cemetery, Brandenburg, Germany.

JAMES ROBERT EWING *B*

Captain, 2nd Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment, late 21st Hussars. Killed 19th May 1915 at Folkestone Junction during the night when inspecting the posts and sentries guarding the railway line under his command. Military funeral in Burwash. Age 53, of Holton House, Burwash, Sussex. **St. Bartholomew's Churchyard, Burwash**

WILLIAM JAMES FIELDWICK *J and P*

Private, G/1344, "D" Company, 9th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 26th September 1915 at the Battle of Loos. Age 23. Born in Burwash. Enlisted in Brighton. Only son of William and Martha Fieldwick of Hospits, Burwash, Sussex. No known grave. Panel 71, Loos Memorial, Pas de Calais. **VISITED**

CLEMENT FORD *P*

Private, G/3980, "C" Company, 2nd Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 25th September 1915 at the Battle of Loos. Age 22. Born in Burwash Common. Enlisted in Hastings. Son of Charles and Ann Ford of West End Cottage, Burwash Common, Sussex. V.G.20 Dud Corner Cemetery, Loos, Pas de Calais. **VISITED**

JAMES GEORGE FULLER *B*

Lance Corporal, L/8163 "B" Company, 1st Bn. The Buffs (East Kent Regiment). Killed in action 7th June 1915 whilst the Bn. was based at Poperinghe. Age 34. Born in Yalding, Kent. Enlisted in Staplehurst. Son of Minnie Anne Willet (formerly Fuller), of High Street, Burwash, Sussex and the late James George Fuller. Husband of the late Jane Fuller. Nine years service in India. No known grave. Panel 14, Ypres, Menin Gate Memorial, Flanders. Battlefield cross in St. Bartholomew's Church porch.

VISITED

JAMES FULLER P

Lance Corporal, SD/922, 11th (1st Southdown) Bn. Royal Sussex. Died of wounds 30th June 1916, 'Battle' of the Boars Head. Leaving a wife and two children. Born Willingdon, Sussex. Enlisted in Hastings. Employed by Mr. Winter at Ponds Farm, Witherenden Hill, Burwash. Buried by the Germans after the battle and then moved to XV P1 Cabaret-Rouge British Cemetery, Suhez, Pas de Calais. **VISITED**

CHARLES HENRY FUNNELL B

Lance Corporal, SD/3768, 13th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 30th June 1916 in the 'Battle' of the Boars Head. Age 32. Born in Etchingham. Enlisted in Hastings. Son of James and Silvie Funnell of Coldharbour, Robertsbridge, Sussex; husband of Charlotte Funnell of Brands Cottage, Fontridge, Etchingham, Sussex. No known grave. Panel 71, Loos Memorial, Pas de Calais. Also on Etchingham Memorial. **VISITED**

FREDERICK FUNNELL B

Private, 63016, 13th Bn. Royal Fusiliers. Killed in action 29th April 1917. Age 31. Born in Burwash. Enlisted in Hastings. Son of Mr. and Mrs Charles Funnell of Perryman's Lane, Burwash and brother of Mrs. Rose A. Mitchell of 68 Beaconsfield Road, Hastings. No known grave. Middle of bay 3, Arras Memorial, Pas de Calais. **VISITED**

THOMAS EDWARD FUNNELL B

Leading Stoker (Boatman), Royal Navy., 299136, H.M.S. ABOURKIR (Cruiser). Killed in action when sunk by enemy submarine U9 in the North Sea 22nd September 1914. Age 32. Son of Mr. James Funnell of Hutchings Farm, Burwash. Panel 4, Portsmouth Naval Memorial. **VISITED**

GEORGE WILLIAM GARDNER C

Sapper, WR/265932, 120th Railway Company. Royal Engineers, formerly RAMC. Died of wounds 4th November 1918. Age 35. Born in Hackney. Enlisted in London. Son of C. Thorpe (formerly Gardner), of Great Bines, Burwash, Sussex and the late Robert Gardner. XII.E.10 Harlebeke New British Cemetery, Flanders. **VISITED**

CHARLES HENRY GODLEY C

Private, G/6367, 8th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 16th October 1917. Age 28. Born in Burwash, Sussex. Enlisted in Hurst Green. Son of Richard and Esther Godley of Hurst Green, Etchingham, Sussex. I D L Minty Farm Cemetery, Flanders. On Hurst Green Memorial. **VISITED**

FRANCIS WHICHER GREENAWAY P

Sapper, 65277, 126th Field Company Royal Engineers. Died of wounds received in action 4th May 1916. Age 26. Born in Wootton Bassett, Wilts. Enlisted in Guildford. Son of Francis William and Fanny J. Greenaway of Tottingworth Park Estate, Heathfield, Sussex. Sang in St. Phillip's choir. 19 La Neuville Communal Cemetery, Corbie, Somme. Also on Heathfield Memorial. **VISITED**

MACDONELL LONGUET HANDCOCK Priest P

Chaplain to the Forces. Attached to The Royal Engineers Army Signalling School, Houghton Regis, Dunstable. Died at Boscombe 6th November 1918 aged 58. One-time Rector of Kirklington, Yorkshire. Born Prince Edward Island, Canada, while his father, a Captain, Royal Navy was stationed there. He had family at Tottingworth Park. Buried with full Military Honours at **St. Philip's Churchyard, Burwash Weald**

ALFRED JAMES HARMER C

Private G/3537, 8th Bn. The Buffs, (East Kent Regiment). Killed in action 26th September 1915 .Battle of Loos. Age 27. Born Burwash, Sussex. Enlisted Hastings. Son of Henry and Harriett Harmer of Crowhurst, Sussex. Husband of Lucy Harriett Harmer of 184 Silverdale Road, Tunbridge Wells, Kent. 8 Pont-a-Vendin Communal Cemetery, Pas de Calais. On Crowhurst Memorial. **VISITED**

HAROLD EDWIN HARMER C

Private, 15832, 11th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 21st October 1916 in attack on Stuff Trench, south of Grandcourt. Age 33. Born in Burwash, Sussex. Enlisted in Hastings. Son of Henry Harmer of Shop Cottage, Crowhurst, Sussex. A.19 Grandcourt Road Cemetery, Somme. On Crowhurst Memorial. **VISITED**

THOMAS HAYLER C

Private, 11018, 1st Bn. Royal Scots Fusiliers. Died . 4th April 1915. Born in Burwash Sussex. Enlisted in Hastings. Resident of Bexhill-on -Sea. II O1 Poperinghe Old Military Cemetery, Flanders. **VISITED**

MAURICE HAROLD OLIVER HAZELDEN C

Private, G/2188, 7th Bn. Queen's Own (Royal West Kent Regiment). Killed in action 13th July 1916 attacking Trones Wood. Age 20. Born in Burwash. Enlisted in Tunbridge Wells. Resident of Frant. Son of Oliver and Emily Hazelden of 4 The Kennels, Eastbourne. Native of Burwash, Sussex. XXX.J.10 Delville Wood Cemetery, Somme. **VISITED**

ALBERT THOMAS HEPDEN B

Private, 58032, 1st Bn. Worcestershire Regiment, formerly Royal Sussex Regiment. Died of wounds 14th October 1918. Age 20. Born in Burwash. .Volunteer Training Ccrps 10th. January 1916. Enlisted in Chichester. Son of Mr. W. Hepden of Phoebe Cottages, Perrymans Lane, Burwash. II.B.6 Pont-du Jour Cemetery, Athies-les-Arras, Pas de Calais. Battlefield Cross in St. Bartholomew's Church porch. **VISITED**

CHARLES HEPDEN B

Private, G/6703, 9th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Killed in action 11th March 1917 near Suhez, below Vimy Ridge. Age 20. Born in Burwash. Enlisted in Hastings. Son of Mrs Elizabeth Hepden of Paygate, Burwash. 1/4 Aix-Noulette Communal Cemetery, Pas de Calais. **VISITED**

JAMES HEPDEN B

5th Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Died 13th March 1922. Age 29.

SETH THOMAS HESELDEN *B*

Private, 1103 "D" Company, 2nd Bn. Royal Sussex Regiment. Wounded 9th May 1915 at Festubert, (Battle of Aubers Ridge). Died of Wounds 31st May 1915. Age 28. Born in Burwash. Enlisted in Hastings. REGINALD FRANK RIMMER

Flight Lieutenant, 39683, pilot of Hurricane fighter V6782 of 229 Squadron, Royal Air Force, based at Northolt. Exploded in combat with Messerschmitt bf109 and crashed at Franchise Manor, Burwash. Killed in action 27th September 1940. Age 21. Son of Lancelot and Cecilia Rimmer of Moels, Hoylake, Cheshire. D 79, Hoylake (Grange) Cemetery, Cheshire.

There is a new memorial stone on north the side of the lane leading down to Franchise Manor.

LUFTWAFFE

BRUNO ZIMMERMAN

Flugzeugfuhrer 67017-118A, pilot of an HE 111 P4 bomber of 1/K225 based at Dreux. Shot down by a Defiant night fighter. Parachute failed to open, Killed in Action at Grandturl Farm, 22nd December 1940. Age 25. Block 1, grave 156 German Military Cemetery, Cannock Chase, Staffordshire. **VISITED**
Originally buried near St. Mary and St. Nicholas, Etchingham.

The bomber crashed at Underwoods House, Etchingham, killing two further crew August Wroblewski and Adolf Waibel (also buried at Cannock Chase 157, 158). The fourth crew member parachuted down safely near Batemans and surrendered in the High Street. He spoke good English as he had been a schoolmaster in Seaford until the outbreak of War and had apparently visited Batemans with his pupils.
